What is Financial Aid and FAFSA? Is there a Difference?

Financial aid is the most common form of payment when attending higher education and it can often cost more than you expect when you are no longer in classes. FAFSA is the application to apply for financial aid. Understanding all the options, including federal financial aid, Pell grant, scholarships, grants, and private funding will help students make the best decisions about funding their educational journey and protect their future.

Ground Campus vs. Online Class – How to Decide

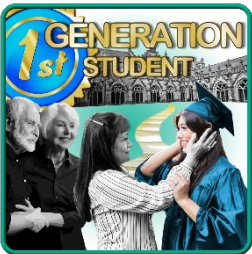
